## **EXTENDED PROGRAMME**& FALLING WALLS SCIENCE SUMMIT

International Falling Walls Lab winners receive the opportunity to pitch their innovative idea at the global finale in Berlin, Germany on 7 November.

Out of 100 presenters, a live jury then announces 3 global winners, which will be "The Breakthroughs of the Year in the category Emerging Talents".

Moreover, winners are offered the exclusive opportunity to engage in a tailored five-day programme during their stay in Berlin, including full access to the Falling Walls Science Summit (7-9 November).

#### 3 BREAKTHROUGHS OF THE YEAR

The three Breakthroughs of the Year in the category Emerging Talents get to present their winning pitches again at the Falling Walls Science Summit on the Breakthroughs of the Year stage on 9 November.





### **CHECKLIST**

Briefing materials and templates are available in the organiser download section. The timeline is not binding, but can serve as a reference during the event planning



#### STEP 1

- Acquaint yourself with the event format
- Review and sign the terms & conditions

#### STEP 2

Ca. 3 months before event

- Acquire partners
- Secure a venue
- Share event details with Lab team in Berlin

#### STEP 3

Ca. 2-3 months before event

- Application form for your Lab opens on Falling Walls website (earliest 15 February 2025)
- Begin marketing activities to receive applications

#### STEP 4

Ca. 1 month before event

- Select jury and notify Lab team in Berlin
- Select presenters and inform all applicants
- Begin guest marketing

#### STEP 5

Ca. 1-4 weeks before event

- Your Lab closes for applications
- Prepare event materials
- Brief participants
   (e.g. presenters, jury,
   photographer,
   moderator)

HOST THE LAB

#### STEP 6

- Send winner information, list of presenters, post-event report, and photos to Lab team in Berlin
- Arrange travel to/from Berlin for your Lab's winner; coordinate winner's accommodation with Lab team in Berlin
- Watch your Lab's winner pitch via livestream or in person at the global finale in Berlin

## ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

Falling Walls Labs are open to students and early-career professionals of all disciplines.

## APPLICANTS MUST BE 18 YEARS OR OLDER WHEN SUBMITTING THEIR APPLICATION. THEY MUST FULFIL AT LEAST ONE OF THE FOLLOWING FORMAL REQUIREMENTS:

- Currently enrolled in university / currently a postdoc
- Awarded a Bachelor's degree no more than 10 years ago
- Awarded a Master's degree no more than 7 years ago\*
- Awarded a PhD no more than 5 years ago\*

#### **PLEASE NOTE:**

- Applications must be submitted in English
- Presenting at a Falling Walls Lab is a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity. Past participants are no longer eligible to apply for a Lab
- The eligibility criteria apply uniformly to all Falling Walls Labs. No exceptions are allowed which limit the participation to students of a single university or specific degrees (e.g. PhD students only)

## APPLICATION PROCESS AND SELECTION

- Applications are submitted centrally via the Falling Walls Lab website
- The Falling Walls Lab team prescreens all applications based on the eligibility criteria and forwards the applications to the international Lab organisers
- The international Lab organisers screen applications and select 15–20 candidates based on the following criteria:
  - Individual: Quality of innovative idea, education and academic grade, relevant work experience
  - Group composition: Gender balance, diversity (nationality, discipline, etc.)

Please make sure to approve/decline applicants in a timely manner.

Submitting multiple applications is not permitted.

## PARTNER ACQUISITION

SECURING PARTNERS FOR AN INTERNATIONAL FALLING WALLS LAB IS PIVOTAL FOR SECURING ADDITIONAL FINANCIAL BACKING\*, ENHANCING ADVERTISING AND PUBLICITY EFFORTS, AND FOSTERING COLLABORATIVE OPPORTUNITIES.

- Should the host organisation not be an academic institution, it is imperative to establish a partnership with at least one academic entity
- For those seeking additional support for the event, Falling Walls provides a sponsorship package template available in the <u>download section</u>. Additionally a curated list of potential partners is also available in the download section
- Organisers are required to obtain approval from the Falling Walls Lab team in Berlin prior to confirming with the partner

## SECURING A VENUE

## SELECTING AN APPROPRIATE VENUE IS CRUCIAL AS IT SETS THE TONE FOR THE EVENT. PLEASE CONSIDER THE FOLLOWING CRITERIA DURING THE VENUE SELECTION PROCESS:

- Ensure the venue is easily accessible and conveniently located for all guests
- Choose a venue with lighting that is suitable for both photography and videography
- Select a venue that comfortably accommodates the expected number of guests
- Ensure the venue is equipped with a video projector and a suitable audio setup

## MARKETING YOUR EVENT

Effective marketing is paramount to the success of any Falling Walls Lab. Broad distribution of the call for applications and strategic promotion of the event are vital to cultivating the distinctive Falling Walls Lab atmosphere.

#### CONSIDER ENGAGING WITH THE FOLLOWING FOR OUTREACH:

- Nearby academic institutions (incl. all faculties and departments)
- Collaborative spaces (e.g. co-working spaces, impact hubs, innovation labs)
- Research communities (e.g. research groups, labs)
- Student organisations (e.g. clubs, associations)
- Start-up networks (e.g. LinkedIn, Facebook)

Harness the power of online and social media to reach a diverse and engaged audience. Consider collaborating with the hosting institution's press office for broader dissemination across official social media channels and mailing lists.



## JURY SELECTION

## SELECTING THE RIGHT JURY MEMBERS IS CRUCIAL FOR THE SUCCESS AND CREDIBILITY OF THE LAB. PLEASE ADHERE TO THE FOLLOWING DURING THE JURY SELECTION PROCESS:

- The jury should consist of a minimum of five members. It is recommended to have an odd number of jurors to avoid tiebreak situations
- Initiate contact with potential jury members as early as possible to ensure their availability on the event day
- Ensure diversity within the jury in terms of:
  - Professional background: Include members from academia, business, media, the public sector, the nonprofit sector and other relevant fields to bring diverse perspectives to the evaluation process
  - Gender: Aim for equitable representation within the jury
- Once the jury members have confirmed their participation, promptly send the finalised jury list using the template in the <u>download section</u> to the Lab team in Berlin



## BRIEFING THE JURY AND PRESENTERS

A thorough briefing for jury members and presenters is vital to ensure the success and smooth execution of every Lab.

- Familiarise yourself with the briefing materials available in the download section
- Distribute the presenter briefing and PowerPoint template to all successful applicants
- PowerPoint presentations are limited to the following four slides:
  - Title slide
  - Problem slide
  - Solution slide
  - Questions slide
- Prepare all voting-related materials in advance and verify the functionality of the evaluation tool
- Provide clear instructions on the jury members' roles and responsibilities
- The jury assesses presentations based on the following criteria:
  - Breakthrough factor (50%) How innovative is the proposed idea?
  - Relevance/Impact (40%) How relevant is the idea to the discipline and beyond?
  - Structure/Performance (10%) How convincing was the presentation?
- Designate a team member responsible for collecting and evaluating the jury voting sheets during the event

## **POST-EVENT TASKS**

## AFTER HOSTING A SUCCESSFUL LAB, THERE ARE SEVERAL IMPORTANT TASKS TO COMPLETE IN PREPARATION FOR THE GLOBAL FINALE:

- Share the winner's contact information with Falling Walls
- Winner Documentation:
  - Confirm that the winner possesses a valid passport
  - If the winner is not an EU/EAA citizen, ensure they have initiated the visa application process
  - Verify that the winner meets current travel requirements to enter the EU if not based in the EU
- Arrange and cover travel expenses for the winner to attend the Falling Walls Science Summit, scheduled from 7-9 November. The extended programme for Lab winners usually takes place starting 5 November
- Contact Falling Walls to arrange a hotel reservation for the winner at our partner hotel
- Upload photos and videos from the event to a file-sharing service (e.g. WeTransfer)
- Submit a comprehensive list of presenters (using the template in the <u>download section</u>). Share press coverage, and fill out our post-event report
